

PSY 310 Topic Selection Journal Guidelines and Rubric

Overview: Journal activities in this course are private between you and the instructor. In order to complete this assignment, you will need to review the Final Project Guidelines and Rubric document and case scenarios.

This journal assignment will provide you with the opportunity to select a topic for your final project assignment.

Prompt: Select a case from the three scenarios provided to guide your final project assignment.

- 1. White Collar Crime (Plain Text Version)
- 2. Serial Murderer (Plain Text Version)
- 3. Domestic Terror (Plain Text Version)

Specifically, the following **critical elements** must be addressed:

- I. **Topic Selection:** Describe why you selected the chosen scenario.
- II. **Crime Type:** Identify the type of crime represented in your chosen scenario.
- III. Motivational Factors: Analyze the individual's motivation for committing the crime.
